

## *Descendants of John Colson Sowers*

### *Generation No. 1*

1. CAPTAIN JOHN COLSON<sup>3</sup> SOWERS (*JACOB*<sup>2</sup>, *JACOB*<sup>1</sup>) was born September 1779 in Winchester, Frederick County, Virginia, and died 1845 in Staunton, Virginia. He married MARY L. HEISKELL 1802 in Winchester, Frederick County, Virginia, daughter of PETER HEISKELL. She was born 1784, and died 1862.

Notes for CAPTAIN JOHN COLSON SOWERS:

John Colson Sowers was a captain in the Virginia Artillery during the War of 1812, being stationed in Staunton, Virginia.

During the session of 1837, the General Assembly passed an act to incorporate the Staunton and Covington turnpike, and ordered books to be opened at Staunton for receiving subscriptions to the same, under John H. Peyton, Benjamin Crawford, Thomas J. Michie, J. C. Sowers, and William Kinney.

Page 379: "As we learn from published military notices, in March, 1812, Christopher Morris was Captain of the Staunton Light Infantry Blues, Moses McCue of the Staunton Artillery, and Briscoe G. Baldwin of the Staunton Infantry Company. We shall hereafter have a brief notice of Captain Morris' company. John C. Sowers was First Lieutenant of the Staunton Artillery, and soon became the Captain. This company and Captain Baldwin's will appear again."

Page 391: " The Fourth of July was celebrated at Staunton by a salute in the morning from the field pieces of the artillery, commanded by Lieutenant Sowers, and a dinner at McDowell's spring; at Greenville by a parade of Captain Abney's and Captain Doak's infantry companies, and Captain Dodd's calvary, and a barbecue on Thomas Jackson's land."

Pages 392 - 393: "A ludicrous incident occurred in Staunton, in connection with the war preparations, in or about 1812. The captain of one of the town companies, who was a man of strict sobriety, felt it incumbent on him to "treat" his men, in accordance with the custom of the times. His wife, then confined to her chamber, had on hand a large supply of brandied cherries, which the captain appropriated and distributed liberally to his company. Of course, he had to partake of them himself, and being unaccustomed to the use of liquor, a very few made him very jubilant and very affectionate to everybody, his wife especially. Hurrying home, he quite overwhelmed the lady with caresses, and she soon discovered the cause of the unusual demonstration. Calling a servant, she ordered that the remaining cherries be emptied into the street gutter. Pigs running at large fell upon the dainties, and after devouring them became drunk and went reeling through the streets like any other toppers, to the great amusement of the town people. As far as known, this was the Captain's first and last spree. \*

Author's note: \*The Captain was John C. Sowers. The incident was related to me by one of his daughters."

Page 395: "The Staunton Artillery was the next company from the county called into service. The officers of this company were: Captain, John C. Sowers; . . . They were in service, at or about Norfolk, from January 4th to April

13, 1814, being attached to a battalion of United States Artillery. The men belonged to the Thirty-second regiment of militia."

Page 400: "For many years there were two relics of the war left at Staunton. Captain Sowers' field pieces - six pounders - remained there until long after the gun carriages had rotted away, but the town boys managed to load and discharge them every Fourth of July and Christmas day. It was not uncommon to find, just when the guns were required for action, that the enemy, in the shape of some mischievous urchin had driven nails into the touch holes. The spikes were withdrawn, however, whatever the labor might be, just as the pieces were shifted from Garber's hill to Green hill, whenever the occasion made a change of position necessary. At length an extremely particular governor came into office, and by his order the guns were seized and taken to the State arsenal at Lexington. Many old Staunton boys must remember our feelings of bereavement and indignation at the ruthless act. But there was no help for it. Staunton was left defenceless, as far as artillery was concerned, and from that day there has been here hardly any observance of the Fourth of July."

Listed in the Columbia Statesman (a weekly newspaper) on March 24, 1865:

Mr. P J Sowers sold his farm of 160 acres a short distance south of this city {Palmyra, Missouri} to Mr. Sites, from Virginia, at \$75 per acre. The Palmyra Spectator (newspaper) was listed as a source for this information.

Probably no more important assemblage ever convened in Marion county than that which met at the court house in Palmyra, December 22, 1860, pursuant to the following published call:---

In view of the unconstitutional legislation in several of the Northern or free States, in opposition to the execution of the Fugitive Slave Act, (a law of Congress, decided by the Supreme Court to be constitutional), and in consequence of such legislation the violent excitement which prevails in several of the Southern States, from which causes the integrity of the Union of the States is imperiled, and a dissolution of the ties that bind us together as one nation is threatened, it is proposed to hold a Mass Meeting of the citizens of Marion county, without respect to party, at the court house, in Palmyra, on Saturday, the 22d of December, at two o'clock, P. M. to adopt such conservative measures as may be deemed proper, to avert, as far as we can, the threatened calamity. Come one, come all.

Note: This is followed by many signatures, one of which is that of P. J. Sowers.

The Last Will and Testament of Peter J. Sowers, Sr.

Know all men by these presents that I, Peter J. Sowers, of the city of Saint Louis, Missouri, being of sound mind and disposing memory but knowing the uncertainty of life and intending hereby to revoke all former wills heretofore made by me do now make, publish, and declare the following as and for my last will and testament, towit;

1. Firstly: It is my will that out of any estate that I may own at the time of my death, there be paid all my just debts and all the expenses of my burial out of the administration of my estate.
2. Secondly: To my son, Peter J. Sowers, now of Macon County, Missouri, I give and devise that certain tract of land containing eighty acres more or less situated in section three of township fifty-seven (57) North and Range thirteen (13) West in said Macon County upon which he now resides and carries on a farm to have and to hold said tract for and during his life; I also give and bequeath to him absolutely all the stock, farming implements, tools and apparatus of every sort which at the time of my death sha..... be upon said farm or be used in connection therewith. In case my said son should die before his wife, Hannah Elizabeth, I desire that said tract of land after his death should go to her, the said Hannah E. to be held and enjoyed by her during her life, and after the death of both said Peter J. and said Hannah E., I desire that it go and do hereby give and devise it to all of the children now or hereafter born of the marriage between them; said Peter J. and Hannah E. in fee simple share and share alike. In case none of said children survive my said son, then it is my desire that the said land after the death of him and said Hannah E shall go to and vest in his heirs.
3. Thirdly: To my daughter Mrs. Mary L. Prewitt, wife of Dr. Theodore F. Prewitt of the city of St. Louis, I give and bequeath a negotiable bond issued by the Commonwealth of Virginia of one thousand dollars, numbered 1048, and bearing interest at the rate of three percent per annum as per coupons attached thereto, which I now own, together with all coupons remaining thereon at the time of my death. This particular legacy is made by me in consideration of the fact that I have heretofore insured my life in favor of my daughter, Mrs. Jane E. Gilliam, wife of John Gilliam, now of Kansas City, Missouri, and with the view of making the several amounts that my said daughter shall receive from me or my estate as nearly equal as possible.
4. Fourthly: Out of the remainder of my estate I give and bequeath unto each of my three sons, John C, Wade W., and Peter J. Sowers the sum of one thousand dollars in money. I hereby empower whichever of the persons hereinafter nominated by me for executor of this will shall qualify as such to sell at his discretion any part of my

property not already hereinafter specifically devised or bequeathed that may be necessary in order to raise money with which to pay said legacies of one thousand dollars each to my said three sons.

5. Fifthly: Sell the rest and residue of my estate whether real, personal, or mixed and wherever situated. I hereby give, bequeath, and devise unto my said two daughters Mary L. Prewitt, and Jane E. Gilliam to be divided between them equally share and share alike.

6. Sixthly: I hereby nominate and appoint my son in law, Dr. Theodore F. Prewitt of said city of Saint Louis to be the Executor of this will and request that he be not required to give any bond as such for the faithful performance of his duties as such. In case of the death of my said son-in-law before my death or of his refusal to qualify as such Executor, I desire and do hereby nominate and appoint John W. Dryden of said city to be the Executor of this will in his stead and request also that no bond be required of him for the faithful performance of his duties as such. In Witness whereof I have hereunto signed my name at the said city of Saint Louis, Missouri on this the nineteenth day of February, A. D. 1887. Signed: Peter J. Sowers.

Sowers, as and for his last will and testament in the presence of us who at his request and in his presence have subscribed our names hereunder as attesting willingness and do now attest the same on this the 19th day of February 1887 at the city of St. Louis, Mo. Signed: A. D. (?); W. (William) Nichols; E (?) Thompkins.

It seems the relationship was strained to the point of never being reconciled during the remaining eight years or so of Peter's life. Peter never saw, it seems, the grandchildren born to him by Mary and John Bennett.
